

Following much careful budgeting by Yealand Redmayne, together with fundraising and donations, they are now pleased to advise there will be TWO De fibrillators in the village, sited at the Village Hall and the Triangle Bus Shelter (installation imminent).

There have been some bad road accidents along the A6 recently and Yealand Redmayne PC asked the Police and County to meet with them to discuss improvements. Following the January meeting, it has been agreed that they will look into ways of reducing speed and perhaps changing the road markings. We will be chasing them up in time for the March meeting.

Yealand Redmayne agreed at the January meeting to keep their precept at the same level as in previous years, despite having made a substantial donation towards the Multi Use Games Area repairs.
